### Adult Immunization Status (AIS-E) 2024

Medicare, Medicaid and Commercial

#### **Measure Description**

Percentage of members ages 19 and older who have had the following vaccinations within the recommended time frame:

- 1 Influenza vaccine
- 1 Td/Tdap vaccine
- 1 (live) or 2 (recombinant) Herpes Zoster (Shingles)
- 1 Adult Pneumococcal vaccine

#### **Required Exclusions**

- Patients who receive hospice or elect to use a hospice benefit anytime during 2024
- Patients who passed away anytime during 2024

#### Vaccine Requirements

#### Influenza Vaccine (19 years of age and older)

- Patients who received an influenza vaccine on or between July 1, 2023 and June 3, 2024, or
- Anaphylaxis due to the influenza vaccine any time during the patient's history through the end of June 3, 2024

#### Td/Tdap Vaccine (19 years of age and older)

- Patients who received at least one Td vaccine between 2015-2024, or
- Patients with a history of at least one of the following contraindications any time during the patient's history through December, 31 2024
  - Anaphylaxis due to the diphtheria, tetanus or pertussis vaccine
  - Encephalitis due to the diphtheria, tetanus or pertussis vaccine

#### Herpes Zoster (50 years of age and older)

- Patients who received at least one dose of the herpes zoster live vaccine or two doses of the herpes zoster recombinant vaccine at least 28 days apart, any time on or after the member's 50th birthday and before or during 2024, **or**
- Patients with anaphylaxis due to the herpes zoster vaccine any time during the patient's history through December 31, 2024.

#### Pneumococcal Vaccine (19 years of age and older)

- Patients who were administered at least one dose of an adult pneumococcal vaccine on or after their 66th birthday during 2024, **or**
- Patients with anaphylaxis due to the pneumococcal vaccine any time during the patient's history through December 31, 2024

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#### **Best Practices**

- Standing orders can help your office staff be part of the vaccination process
- Offer vaccine information sheets to read while patients wait
- Medical assistants can verify interest and obtain the vaccine to be administered
- Train staff to answer questions, administer and document in the patient's chart
- Have office staff wear pins that show they've been vaccinated to help prompt patients to ask questions
- Provide patients information about vaccines based on timing and eligibility
- Place images and information about vaccinations throughout your office
- Code appropriately for the vaccinations given
